## Why I generously support local Black based causes every month or year? Because:

- I condemn the fact that no one was brought to justice for slavery which included mental and physical abuse, rapes, murders, that were directed towards Blacks who historically never committed any of the same crimes at that horrific level against anyone. And yet if a Black person commits a much lesser crime, he or she is prosecuted to the furthest extent of the law which has been up to 25 years in jail.
- I condemn that the wrongs of slavery were never formally made right by those who can. Example: No compensation for 400+ years of unpaid labour. No free top of the line education provided in order to begin the healing for economic prosperity and qualified enough to be employable. No land given which was promised. Tax preferential treatment. And anything necessary to establish equality for all.
- I condemn the negative stereotypes that are directed towards people of colour, particularly young Black males. Examples: Police profiling and carding. When a Black male is shot, killed, kills someone or is the subject of violence, his picture is splattered on T.V. and his mug is on the front page of the newspapers. Why don't they show the good and bad facts of these young Black males so that people can make an unbiased conclusion? Instead, since the inception of Canada and up to now, they removed all the positive contributions and accomplishments of Blacks from the history books by teaching "his story" and then teach for a lifetime the negative stereotypes of the Blacks in the media.
- I condemn that Black history is not taught in all schools and made mandatory on a federal level. The first Blacks were brought over from Africa to Canada over 400 years ago and to this day the Blacks has not garnered enough respect to be acknowledged in the history books so that Blacks can be proud of their heritage, be proud that they were the ones who mostly were responsible for the building of this country and to increase the chances for non Blacks to truly respect and appreciate Blacks so we can have a chance to move in the right direction to eliminate racism. Black history in North America was excluded from "his story" books. To go even further, the truth needs to be taught about Aboriginal history. The Aboriginals are damaged more than everyone and the damage continues even to this day. Just simply teaching all the history would include anyone who made a contribution to the building of Canada. For several years, Canada has become a melting pot of cultures and even to this day, only European and false Aboriginal his story is taught to our children. This education agenda of disrespect for those who are not European or Aboriginal is simply an insult.
- I condemn that there are more Blacks in jails than there ever was during slavery and this is mainly because of the lack of economic opportunity. Now with the help of forensic evidence, many have been proven to be innocent after serving, in most cases, a lengthy time in jail but now their lives has been damaged forever. Fair and quick restitution must be given to these innocent people. Minorities, mainly Blacks and Aboriginals, are the majority who are in jail and the reason why is due to the lack of economic opportunity.
- I condemn that Blacks who were and still are set up for economic failure. Example: Refusal to hire qualified Black applicants and hire only White applicants for employment. Last to get hired, but first to get fired. Minorities earn lower pay than their White colleagues. Economic inequality. Destructive economic targeting. Retirement bankruptcy and there's more.
- I condemn that the Black community is the most underserved and underfunded of all communities by far.

I am aware that minorities, mainly Blacks, have and still are unfairly treated and I'm prepared get involved in order to even the playing field. I am trustworthy enough to make right the wrongs because it's the right thing to do. I will do my fair part like Bill and Melinda Gates, Warren Buffet, Richard Branson, Sean Penn, Paul Walker Mike Holmes, Angelina Jolie and several others who are doing anything that they can to distance themselves from those who would love nothing more but to destroy the Black race. Non Blacks also joined in to march at the Civil rights movement and some of them died because they believed it was the right thing to do. Now we are not asking you to risk your life to do the right thing, instead we are asking for much less which is to allocate a fair percentage of your annual contributions to other causes you support, to help repair the damaged Black community, which is the very same people who you may have ongoing relationships with. In order to authenticate your relationship(s) with Black people, you need to support local Black based causes. Ask yourself: What did the Black race do to deserve this past and present unacceptable treatment? Do I have any Black history material in my personal library? Have I ever supported a local Black based cause? Do I want to be regarded, by the Black the community, as at the very least a passive racist if I choose not to a support local Black based cause(s) regularly and generously every month or year when I am fully capable on doing so?

Q: What is a passive racist?

A: A passive racist is someone who develops a relationship with someone outside of their race but chooses not to support regularly and generously to their local race causes which compared to other causes, are significantly underserved and underfunded.

Here's another definition for a passive racist:

Beliefs, attitudes, and actions that contribute to the maintenance of racism, without openly advocating violence or oppression. The conscious or unconscious maintenance of attitudes, beliefs, and behaviours that support the system of racism, racial prejudice and racial dominance.

As the saying goes, "Keep your friends close, but your enemies closer." It appears that several non Black people are employing this tactic and it is confirmed when they choose not to support local Black based causes. Everyone is capable of doing something to help repair the damaged local Black community, whether it is to regularly and generously contribute to a creditable local Black cause, volunteer, mentor, tutor, etc..

What would my Black friends think or do if I told them that I am now fully aware of some of the unfortunate realities of Black community in North America, I have never and choose not to regularly and generously support and/or get involved with a local Black based cause?

Now you know about some of the unfortunate realities of the past, present and a projection of the future if a different course of action is not taken concerning mainly the Black race in North America which is well overdue. Please do your own investigations to verify the above-noted information that you just read before making a decision. Positive and ongoing action from you is the only way to regain trust from the Black community. According to a recent report by B.M.O.
